**New science and art center is named.** The new center for science and art has been officially named after **Diane Garthwaite** (parent of **Darcy Brennan '99**). Diane, current chair of the Capital Campaign Leadership Committee, previously served as chair of the Board of Trustees for four years. At the official launch of the “Changing Lives” campaign at the DeCordova Museum in October, **Jane Moulding**, head of school, announced the new state-of-the-art, “green” building will be named **The Diane Garthwaite Center for Science and Art**. “Diane has helped bring CSW to this magical moment in our history, by donating an initial \$3 million as seed money to launch the capital campaign,” said Moulding. Since making her initial donation, Diane has generously given an additional gift as a challenge grant to inspire increased participation from alumni.

**Alorie Parkhill to be honored in March.** **Alorie Parkhill** will be honored formally for her 43 years of dedicated service to The Cambridge School of Weston on March 11 at the Weston Golf Club. In addition to Alorie's son **Paul '87** and daughter **Rebecca '85**, Jane Moulding, head of school, and **George Cohan**, former head, will provide remarks at the event. Proceeds from the event will benefit **The Alorie Parkhill Endowed Fund for Teacher Mentoring and Training** which will help perpetuate the school's legacy of outstanding teachers and inspired teaching. The fund's goal has been set at \$500,000. A generous gift of \$35,000 was donated by the Parkhill family as an initial investment in the fund. **CSW faculty and staff respond to endowment survey.** The “Changing Lives” Campaign aims to increase CSW's endowment by \$4.4 million, which will bring the school's total endowment to approximately \$10 million. In December, faculty and staff were asked to help inform the preparation of the school's endowment section of the Capital Campaign Case Statement, the primary document that will be used to solicit contributions from new donors. Endowing faculty salaries has already been identified as the primary goal for the school's endowment efforts; however, faculty and staff were asked to help identify other programs and areas, for which campaign funds will be solicited, allocated and spent.
