The speaking engagement will cap a week of special programs on the CSW campus. Possible areas of concentration for seminar leaders include: environmental conservation and advocacy, global warming, alternative energy, biodiversity, sustainable architecture or other environment-friendly topics. After reading a story in *the Gryphon* on the new state-of-the-art **Garthwaite Center for Science and Art** to be completed this fall, **Robert Friesen '71** was inspired to organize his classmates to contribute to a fund for the new sustainable building. His efforts started with an appeal to just ten classmates asking for \$250 each, and expanded from there. To date, the class has collected more than \$5,000, with more contributions on the way. Alorie Parkhill Endowed Fund for Teacher Mentoring and Training is off to a good start. At the March 11 gala event honoring Alorie’s 44 years of inspired teaching and dedicated service to CSW, **John Thompson**, chair of the Development Committee, announced to more than 200 assembled guests, that the school had raised more than \$153,000 toward the fund. The goal, by the end of the campaign, is \$500,000.
