**"Changing Lives" choice quote:** In February, MIT Frederick G. Keyes Professor of Chemistry **Richard R. Schrock**, who won a 2005 Nobel Prize in chemistry, visited the new, state-of-the-art Garthwaite Center to talk with **Marilyn DelDonno**'s Chemistry class about his prize-winning research on "olefin metatheses," and what it was like to win a Nobel Prize. He toured the new Center for Science and Art, and admired the building's many sustainable features. During Reunion 2006, Schrock's son, **Andrew '96**, graciously donated a poster to the school that had been presented to his father at the 2005 Nobel award ceremonies, and that bears signatures by Schrock and two other chemistry laureates. "What was surprising to the students was how modest and approachable Schrock was. He seemed like an 'ordinary' person who was having great fun doing science, and who never really thought that he'd get a Nobel Prize," said DelDonno, chair of the science department.
